

Technical Solutions Intercom Hands free & Switch Operated

These intercoms are individually configured to be accessible for people with disabilities. They can be set up as a combination doorbell and intercom, and even be used to operate electric doors or door lock releases.

Multiple intercom stations can be used for communication between different rooms - for example, stations could be set up in the bedroom, lounge, kitchen and carers sleep-over room. As well as external doorbell stations outside the front and back doors. Up to two doors can be controlled from any of the internal stations. Up to two external doorbell stations can be installed outside the front and back doors.

Operation Summary

Calls from the External Station.

A visitor must press to ring the door bell and then press to talk but the inside 'Master' intercom station can be used **Hands Free**. This allows a disabled person communicate with the visitor without pressing any buttons.



Calls from a carer to their client.

The carer can press a call button initiate a call to the client. The carer can then press a button to talk while the client can talk **Hands Free**

Calls from a disabled person to their carer.

The client/patient can call for help by activating an appropriate switch – we can supply a wide range of special switches to meet various abilities. Activation of the switch will initiate a call to the carer. The carer can respond by pressing a button to talk while the client can talk **Hands Free**.
